Session Title: *“Sprucing Up Your Centers With Technology”*

The collection of activities teachers provide students during Center Time or Station Rotation can be enhanced with technology, even if there’s only a limited number of computers or tablets in the classroom. Whether you use centers for reading, writing, listening, speaking, or exploration, it’s great to know about online resources that are perfect for independent and cooperative activities. Learn to leverage technology to give learning centers a boost, especially when it comes to setting the course, providing content, supporting creativity, and capturing responses. Tony Vincent shares a variety of resources for K-12 teachers and students. All resources are free, so you can get to retooling your learning centers right away! Please bring earphones and a laptop, Chromebook, or iPad so that you can participate in our sample Center Time.

Bio:

The only thing Tony Vincent likes better than teaching is learning. He enjoys technology because it continually gives him something new to learn. Since 1998 he’s been a pioneer in digital learning, having a class website where his fifth graders in Omaha, Nebraska shared their writing, art, and projects with the world. In 2001 he had a 1:1 classroom full of Palm Pilots, and in 2004 he started one of the first podcasts by kids.

Today Tony Vincent lives in Council Bluffs, Iowa and works as a self-employed consultant. He’s on a mission to help teachers be their best by connecting them with technology. He has traveled to 41 states, Canada, Australia, England, and the Caribbean to facilitate workshops and to make presentations. Session Title: “Human Trafficking”

Program Description:

Jean Tong-Noon will be presenting on issues related to human trafficking, including how it impacts all ages from students to parents, and all socio-economic levels. She will be covering the tactics used to draw individuals in, signs to look for that are evidence of trafficking, and how to guard our students and families against trafficking. Included in the session will be the use of social media postings to blackmail and otherwise go after our youth. Jean is intending to bring individuals from Homeland Security and the State Attorney’s office as well to present with her.

Presenter Bio:

Jean Tong-Noon is with Thread of Life International and has worked for years in the area of human trafficking. She is often used as a speaker on the issue for civic and community events. She has been deputized by the State’s Attorney Department and works closely with them as well.

**Session Title: “*Drugs and Meds Use/Abuse Affecting Students and Families*” – a.m.
“*Issues Related to Narcan and Informed Families Programs for Our Schools*” – p.m.**

Program Description:

This first session will deal with how and what types of drugs and meds are affecting students and their families in today’s settings. Peggy Sapp of Informed Families along with Assistant State Attorney Akilah Bain from the Drug Court and Assistant State Attorney, Jessica Sinkfield, from Community Outreach will be the presenters. They will be covering the different types of drug use that are prevalent, and the types of prescription drug misuses that are prevalent, where the students are obtaining these items and signs to look for when determining trouble. The speakers will also cover issues related to Narcan and the programs that are implemented by Informed Families that we can use in our schools to combat misuse and abuse.

Peggy Sapp is the head of Informed Families, Akilah Bain is an Assistant State Attorney in the Miami Dade Drug Court and Jessica Sinkfield is an Assistant State Attorney in the Community Outreach Department.
